




IN MEMORIAM

DUŠAN SAVA LAJOVIC



Celebrating the life of Dušan Lajovic.

Born in Ljubljana, Dušan worked with his father and other members of his family in their family business. His legacy, the factory Tuba, is still there and his great dream of Slovenia as an independent and democratic country in the European Union is realized.

In the 1960's Slovenian people gathered in local parks and picnic areas to celebrate their culture and heritage. Eventually a dedicated core of those people believed that they could strengthen relationships for in their community by forming a club. It would provide a home away from home where members could share stories of their struggle and celebrate their creation of a new life. In 1972 Triglav Klube was born out of that formative aspiration to provide a venue where Slovenian people could come together to preserve what they brought to Australia, and indeed share that with their new countrymen. In true Slovenian style people came together to create the reality. Thousands of hours were donated by generous builders of all professions and other helping hands to create this place for the people. The members celebrated the opening in 1982. Just as the builders created the building, so too, volunteers came together to preserve the Slovenian community, their language and their culture. They grew a cultural family offering a language school, a folklore group, a Men's choir , a dance group, and a drama group, and of course the club supported a plethora of sporting activities. The Triglav Badge is a symbol of what this club means to all Slovenians in Australia. Triglav Mountain depicts the strength of Slovenia. The boomerang represents the transition of the culture to its new home in Australia. The Slovenian community have always gathered under this badge, comforted in the knowledge that both countries, have provided for the creation of this great club.

Tania has always had a strong affinity with Slovenia and her Slovenian relatives. She attended the Slovenian School of Community Languages and matriculated in the Slovenian Course. Following her high school graduation, she took a gap year and traveled to and lived in, Slovenia. She returned to Slovenia with her own family on numerous occasions, to ensure the connection continues with her own children."

Tania completed her Bachelor of Physiotherapy at the University of Sydney in 1993. In 2000 Tania married

Peter, forming their own family with their children, Aidan and Charlise. She built her career in physiotherapy whilst juggling family commitments and is currently the Senior Physiotherapist in the Department of Pain Medicine at St Vincent's Hospital, Sydney. Here she has been an educator and mentor for other healthcare professionals in the specialty of chronic pain and an integral member in the development of new chronic pain services, including access to specialty clinical services across Australia. Tania also teaches and lectures at the University of Sydney and Australian Catholic University as an expert in management of chronic pain.

Most recently Tania successfully graduated from a PhD at the University of Sydney. In 1970, the Slovenian Australian club Planica Wollongong was founded, and Tone joined and became a member of the committee. Immediately he was taking part in the preparation of all social events, the Wollongong Show, the various parades and the Kmečka ohcet in 1975 and 1977, and also in all regular social gatherings in different hired halls. In the year 1983 Planica bought the present club's premises in Figtree. Tone helped when the premises were rebuilt, improved and expanded and Slovenian Church of All Saints reorganised.

For 35 years, Tone and his wife, often made sure that the church was decorated and cleaned for the monthly Sunday services. They took turns in preparing and serving food at festive occasions and when various performers, singers and musicians and church dignitaries visited the club and the little Church of All Saints next door.

Tone helped build the bocce courts. For many years he was responsible for the Bocce section and for the regular bocce competitions. Even now in his mature years he still does a lot of the maintenance of the courts and tries to play the game as often as his health permits. Over the years, Tone has visited Slovenia 7 times, often with his children and grandchildren who share his love of the old country and enjoy visiting relatives there. A high achiever and passionate about social welfare, it was therefore not surprising that Nicole would choose to study at the Western Sydney University doing a Bachelor of Community Welfare. Due to her dedication to her studies she had been awarded the prestigious Michael Cusack Memorial Award in 2015 and 2017 for the most outstanding student enrolled in the degree. She had also received the Dean's Merit Award in 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 for placing in the top [10%] of the degree.

Nicole hopes to continue her studies with a post-graduate qualification

focusing on inclusive education and disability studies. Whilst studying, Nicole did an internship with Salesforce, a multinational IT marketing company, where she was involved with working with the APAC Services team on projects for different clients. In addition to this, she was invited to join two youth leadership programs run by Telstra and Commonwealth Bank. These programmes focused on bringing together young people with Cerebral Palsy to network with members of the organisation and build awareness of CP within the workplace. Nicole is an advocate and role model for the disabled community participating in many initiatives that seek to build awareness of people with a disability. She has been a speaker for the 'Just like You' programme which is coordinated by the Cerebral Palsy Alliance and run at primary schools in NSW to increase children's knowledge of people with disabilities and has also done fundraising for them through their 'Steptember' challenge.

This passion for community and hard work stems from Nicole's heritage and cultural ties, her closeness to her grandparents who have educated her on the Slovenian tradition, values and beliefs. An exceptional young woman who has achieved a great deal in her life and is a worthy recipient of this award.



Gabriela Nitsolas-Pirc was born in Fairfield in 1979, to Milan and Jelka Pirc. She is married to Dimitrios and is the proud mother of two young children Jelka and Nikolas. Raised in a loving home where pride and traditional Slovenian values were instilled, Gabriela studied the Slovenian language at the Bankstown School of Community Languages where she excelled, finishing 1st in the state.

Gabriela studied at the University of Western Sydney where she achieved a double degree and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts, majoring in Psychology

and a Bachelor of Laws with Honours. Admitted as a Solicitor in 2003, she continued her education including a Management Certification with Distinction in 2006 and a Graduate Diploma in Family Dispute Resolution in 2017.

She began her career as a solicitor in private practice but moved to work for the NSW's Attorney General's Department in 2004 becoming the Director responsible for helping those less fortunate gain access to fair and equitable treatment with the justice system. As a published author in the area of Restorative Justice and its application in practice she has had the chance to give back to the education sector by teaching Business Law. Both Ivan and Clara were born in different regions of Slovenia. They met and married in Australia. With their three daughters they were all very much part of the St Raphael's community here. Ivan was involved with carpentry and cabinet making and there seems to be a piece of his work in every part of the St Raphael's complex. Much of the work was done gratis as well as having donated materials. Ivan's successful career spanned many decades, his work included kitchens as well as custom made fine furniture and French polishing.

Initially a deli manager, Clara got a calling to be a volunteer teacher of scripture (S.R.E.) and embraced this ministry in our state schools. After twenty years of service Clara received a Papal blessing, an award for 25 years of service by Bishop Anthony Fisher OP and most recently an award by Bishop Vincent Long Van Nguyen OFM Conv. for 30 years of service. Having completed a Diploma in Formation and Pastoral Ministry, then training for Extra Ordinary Minister of Communion, Clara caters to the needs of our Slovenian community and is involved with the Pastoral committee working on how to keep the decreasing parishioners together. Raising a family with 4 children, Jože and his wife Irena worked extremely hard splitting day and night shifts to ensure the family had everything they needed. Jože was extremely passionate about maintaining the Australian/Slovenian culture within his family and the local community. This passion led to his strong affiliation with the Triglav Club from 1977-1983.

Jože lived on site with his ever-growing family as a caretaker in the downtime of the club's social activities. His dedication to the club was appreciated very much and he was selected for the

position as manager of the club and was recognised as one of the best managers they'd ever had. In the early years when all work at the club was done by volunteers,

The highest peak of the Julian Alps, Mt. Triglav, which rises to 2864 m, was respected by several peoples (Celts, Romans, Lombards and Slavs) crossing the territories of Slovenia. Mt. Triglav was just a border area until the Enlightenment period in Slovenia. Mt. Triglav became the inspiration to several poets, writers, travelers, painters, politicians and it became the symbol of Slovenians. Ever since the 19th century, when mountaineering in the Alps became popular, the Triglav Mountain Range has attracted numerous visitors. Through fables connected with it and the beautiful landscape surrounding it, Mount Triglav is one of the most prominent peaks in the eastern Alps. From spring to autumn it is visited by entire processions of mountain lovers. No wonder it is said that "you are not a true Slovenian until you have climbed Triglav".

THE OLD VINE WORLD OLDEST VINE

Maribor - Slovenia

In the heart of the oldest part of Maribor, on Lent, grows the oldest vine in the world. Growing in front of the Old Vine House, the "Žametovka" or "Modra Kavčina" vine is estimated to be over 450 years old. It holds a place in the Guinness Book of Records as the oldest noble vine in the world still bearing grapes. The Old Vine is a symbol of the rich wine culture of Maribor, Styria, and all of Slovenia.



The Old Vine was planted towards the end of the Middle Ages, during the Ottoman invasion. It survived furious fights between the invaders and the defenders, as the Old Vine House used to be part of the city wall. In the face of fires and the vine lice that destroyed many others, the Old Vine survived. The resilient plant even withstood the bombardment of the Allied forces during World War II that partly destroyed the Old Vine House. In paintings of Maribor dating back to 1657 and 1687, the Old Vine is evident.

It has been determined that the Old Vine in paintings dated 1657 was already at least 100 years old. These pictures are exhibited at the Styrian Provincial Museum in Graz. Scions of the Old Vine can now be found growing throughout Slovenia and in almost all continents worldwide. The Old Vine was brought to Australia by Vinko and Elica Rizmal, and gifted to the Shire of Yarra Ranges on behalf of the Mayor of Maribor. It can be found at Burrinja Cultural Centre, Upwey in the Yarra Ranges, as well as throughout Australia.

It is considered a gesture of friendship when the Old Vine is planted on public land and represents for Slovenian Australians the strong cultural connection between Maribor, Slovenia and Australia.



IN SLOVENIAN DESCENDANTS OF THE WORLD OLDEST GRAPE VINE ON THEIR WAY TO AUSTRALIA MARCH 1999

One year-old rootling and six newly cut grafts were sent to Australia in March 1999. Two years later in May 2001 with a clean bill of health, the plants were released from Quarantine and presented to the project initiators Vinko & Elica Rizmal.

The oldest plant was finally handed over to the Shire of Yarra Ranges as a gift from the City of Maribor, Slovenia in June 2001 at a Gala night celebrating the 10th anniversary of the Slovenian Republic, organized by the Slovenian National Council of Victoria Inc. The plant was formally handed over to the then Mayor of the Shire of Yarra Ranges, Ms Di Moore, represented in the hand-over ceremony by the then deputy Mayor Mr. James Merlino, today an MP and Deputy Premier in the Victorian Government.

The vine was handed over by Mr. And Mrs. Razdevšek, official representatives of the Mayor of Maribor Mr. Boris Sovič. On the same night, the gifted plant was entrusted to Mr. Max McWilliams, director of McWilliams Lillydale Vineyards, to be planted at a later date. International and local representatives witnessed the handover of the 400-year-old grape vine from the Mayor of Maribor to the Mayor of Shire of Yarra Ranges.

Many discussions and changes were carried out to increase the presence and significance of the descendants of the world's oldest vine in Australia. The latest very promising discussion was between Old Vine project initiator Vinko Rizmal and the current Mayor of Shire of Yarra Ranges Cr Toni Stevenson on 26th April 2019.
